- 1. The member offering the motion to refer to a committee is not allowed to specify whether it is to go to a standing or special committee.

- 3. In the preface of the *Parliamentary Guide for FFA*, all parliamentary laws and rules addressed in this book are said to be in agreement with those of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised 10th Edition.

- 17. A vote is required to order a standing vote.
- 18. Unfinished business is discussed after the officer reports.
- 19. A member may offer an amendment to an amendable motion after the chair states the question and the member obtains the floor.
- 20. During the reading of the minutes of a regular meeting it is important to state how many members were present and the name of the person who gave each of the committee reports.
